Another Indian Fight-Two Soldiers Wounded. We are informed that some days since a body of Indians were discovered docupying a strong position and protected by well constructed log houses, four in number, plared with loop holes so arranged as to guard approach from all directions. These houses were-some 16x22-feet in size, and within which was a spring of water., The location as described to us is about five miles from Angel's Ranch, toward Redwood creek, and about one mile south of the old Trinity trail, leading from Arcata to the Trinity river. As soon as this intelligence reached Fort Gaston, Lieut-Middloton was detailed with thirty-five men to attack them. He arrived upon the ground on the morning of_the_25th;_and __immediately engaged: the Ludians. After two hours fighting, and having one of his men wounded, and tinding it impossible to dislodge them. he withdrew his men out of range, andawnited reinforcements. Some time during-the night following Capt-Ousleyund Lieut. Beckwith arrived with more men and a mountain howitzer, and in the morning the attack was reitered, the howitzer throwing shells, several bursting in the houses, causing the Indians to set up a howl that inade the mountains ring -The ammunition-for the howitzer having been exhausted, more was sent for meantime the fighting censed. During the fight on the second day private. Smith, Co. B, was wounded. Night. coming on again the men were stationed at different points, with the view to prevent the escape of . the Indians. - During the night Col. Whipple arrived with a supply-of-shulls for the howitzer. But -before morning the Indians and escaped, packing all but two of their dead and wounded. Four rifles were captured besides any amount of 'Indian camp equipuge. The night was very foggy to which factimay be attributed their escape .----One hundred and twenty-five men" have been put upon their track. It is not known what loss the Indians suffered, but it must have been severe as several. shells burst in the houses. The houses and everything in them were destroyed." ? Private Leonard, who was wounded the first day, belongs to Company C.

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
