\* INDIAN WAR.—By the following from the Humboldt *Times*, it will be seen that this long threatened Indian war is reaching a crisis. The *Times* says:

The intelligence lately received from Fort Gaston and the country around Hoopa Valley, induces the belief that the Indians are preparing themselves for a desperate struggle. The Hoopa's have now called upon the Klamath river Indians to join them in their war against the white man. That the Indians are now about to unite and prosecute the war on their part with a vigor never before exhibited seems altogether probable.— They have given the citizens of Hoopa Valley, and Major Taylor in command at Fort Gaston, notice to leave. Much excitement exists there, and we learn that reinforcements have been called for from Fort Humboldt.
