

Indian Difficulty at Chico.

The Alta. of last week, contained an account of a difficulty which occurred at Major Bidwell's Ranch in this county, on Wednesday week. Knowing the Pacific character of the Indians at Maj. Bidwell's we did not credit the report. We now learn however, that the main features of the account were correct. The difficulty was with Indians who had gone to the Ranch for the purpose of fighting with the Indians of Maj. Bidwell. They had taken possession of one of the Indian houses, and in attempting to dislodge them, the Major and his party were fired upon. A Mr. Schaeffer was shot through the lungs and lived but a short time. Five of the Indians were killed. They had not only threatened war against the Indians living on the Ranch, but had also threatened to take the life of Major Bidwell.
