

KLAMATH RESERVATION.—By reference to our Washington news, it will be seen that a strip of land on the Klamath river, one mile on each side, and extending from its mouth about twenty miles up stream, containing twenty-five thousand acres, has been reserved by order of the President as a military Reservation for the Indians. If any portion of California is to be reserved for the Indians, we certainly approve of the one selected in our neighboring county. The tract selected will not be required by white people for years if ever, and the great river traversing it will supply the natives with the greater portion of their food. The difficulty, we imagine, will arise when the agent attempts to collect the surrounding tribes within the limits of this Reservation. They are much attached to their old homes and manner of living, and have not the clearest conceptions of the obligations of treaties and promises.
