

INDIAN CONVENTION.—The meeting on Indian affairs, as will be seen from the published proceedings, adopted resolutions in favor of the immediate return of the Indians to the Klamath Reservation and requesting the Agent in charge of the Reservation to remove them as soon as practicable.

If the Indians are not taken back and made to remain on the Reservation it will not be the fault of the people of this county, for their expression, through the delegates to the Convention, was very decided in favor of such a course.

The subject of apprenticing Indians under the act passed last winter was brought before the Convention. The propriety of such a system was questioned by many delegates, but the right of those who choose to do so, to avail themselves of the benefits of the law was admitted. No action was, however, taken by the Convention on the subject.
