

THE INDIAN WAR.—The Humboldt *Times*, of  
January 2d, gives an account of a fight between  
Lieut. Middleton and thirty-five men, and a few  
Humboldt Indians entrenched in some small  
houses near Trinity river. During the two days  
fight two men, Leonard and Smith, were wound-  
ed. On the night of the second day's fight the  
Indians vacated the houses and fled, followed by  
a force of 125 men.
