

INDIAN DEFICIENCIES.—We are assured by a gentleman, who feels confident of the correctness of his statement, that we were misinformed as to the unpaid bills which are yet to come in, against the war expedition of last Winter in Trinity and Humboldt. He states that the bills not paid will fall considerably short of \$5,000. We hope the figures will sustain his statement.

The Pitt River Expedition he also puts down at not over \$75,000, which is more good news. Our estimate was made upon the cost of those which preceded it. When the bills are all in, we shall be gratified to learn that an appropriation of \$75,000 is all that is needed from the State.

We repeat the suggestion that the policy of declaring, conducting and paying for Indian wars, ought to be changed so as to have the bills audited against the General Government. It is the duty of that Government to protect the State against Indian depredations and outrages, and the Legislature should speak its mind upon that point very plainly to Congress. The Quartermaster General's report will soon be before the public.
