

MORE INDIAN TROUBLES.—Five White men Killed.—By the steamer *Humboldt*, which arrived this morning, we get the following news:
News came to Union on the 15th inst., that five white men were murdered by the Klamath Indians, near Orleans Bar, on the 12th inst. Col. Buchanan immediately sent a detachment of 25 U. S. troops, under the command of H. W. Judah, to the Bar, and also a party of volunteers from Union. Considerable difficulty is apprehended, as the Indians have sent all the squaws and children into the mountains. The names of two of the men who were murdered were Wheeler and O'Neill, who were both traders.—*Journal.*
