Davis, it was *Resolved*, That we, the citizens of Hydesville, deem it expedient for each and every precinct in this county to hold meetings for the purpose of making out claims for time, money, provisions and stock, lost by Indians for the last two years, and to elect delegates to carry the amounts of the accounts to Eureka, on the first Tuesday in February, so that the whole amount may be condensed and forwarded to our Representatives in the Legislature, asking them to demand of the State the amount of said claims.

On motion, Mr. Wright was appointed delegate for this precinct.

Moved, that a copy of these proceedings be forwarded to the HUMBOLDT TIMES for publication.

On motion, the meeting then adjourned.
