STATE LAW.
**AN ACT CONCERNING MARKS
 AND BRANDS.**
 1. Every person, being the owner of
 horses, mules, cattle, sheep, goats, or
 hogs, shall have and keep a mark and
 brand, different from the marks and
 brands of his neighbors, and the brand
 as far as practicable, or to the knowledge
 of such owner, shall be different from
 any other brands in the State, and the
 mark different from any other in the
 county.
 2. Every such owner, shall deliver
 to the Recorder of his County a full
 description of his ear-mark, and pre-
 sent to him his branding iron, and said
 Recorder shall record the same in a
 book to be kept by him for that purpose,
 giving the form of the iron in the re-
 cord, and a full description of the ear-
 mark: *Provided*, that if said Recorder
 shall be satisfied that the mark or brand
 tendered to him for record is similar to
 another mark or brand in the county,
 he shall require of such person to

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE.
 MONDAY, Jan. 27.
IN SENATE.—After some un-
 important business, Mr. Heydenfeldt,
 from the majority of the committee,
 to which was referred the bill, con-
 cerning divorces, reported the same
 back to the Senate, and recommended
 that it be non-concurred in, on the
 ground that it is unconstitutional to
 legislate upon the subject.
 Mr. Tingley, from the same com-
 mittee, presented a minority report
 recommending the bill.
 On motion of Mr. Van Buren they
 were ordered to lie on the table, and
 leave was granted to the minority of
 the Committee to present another re-
 port.
 Mr. Heydenfeldt rose to a question
 of privilege, and read a protest against
 the action of the majority of the Sen-
 ate in the case of Messrs. Van Buren
 and Fair, and asked that the same be
 spread upon the journals of the Sen-
 ate. Granted.
 On motion of Mr. Tingley, a select
 committee was appointed to unite
 with one from the House, to examine
 the accounts of the Comptroller and
 State Treasurer. Messrs. Crosby,
 Tingley and Van Buren were ap-
 pointed.
