One gentleman alone, Mr. Woodman, had lost 109 head of borses, 74 of which were found dead in a canon not far-from lie place, and upon the bodies of which the indiana were having a good least. On the 19th of December the settlers turned exit wild writing the enemy succeeded in killing 32 and taking two prisoners. U.S. troops located in that region are represented in be pursuing, during all these troub les a "misterly course of junctivity." The aid of the States has therefore been asked and will we trust be granted.
