

Good.—Congressman Sargent has telegraphed to Sacramento that he is wholly opposed to Mr. Hinson's Smith River Reservation; and will most likely see that Government does not confirm the Superintendent's "conditional purchase." The only suitable place for a Reservation on this coast is the peninsula, between this bay and the ocean, extending from the mouth of Mad river to the entrance. Do away with the Indian department altogether, if you will, make the peninsula a reserve, place it under the military arm of the Government, and, with a suitable officer in command of this District, our Indian troubles will soon be at an end. We shall have more to say on this subject when the proper time arrives.
