

~~Indian Commission.~~ The concurrent resolution, which has been introduced by Mr. Van Dyke, published in last week's Times, asking for the appointment of an Indian Commission by the President of the United States, is a subject in which many of our readers are interested. The object of the Commission is to place the matter before Congress in such a shape that action will be taken to pay these just claims. Congress will not act on the claims audited by our State officers, but require more satisfactory evidence. This Commission, being the agent of the Federal Government, could present the result of its investigations in a clear manner, which would be the basis for an appropriation. Unless some means are taken soon to

preserve the evidence of loss, parties will
never be remunerated, for witnesses are
constantly being removed, by death and
otherwise, beyond the reach of the suffer-
ers.
