

\$250 REWARD.

Frequent complaints having been made to the Court of 1st Instance of Sacramento District of the unprovoked murder of unarmed and unoffending Indians which has caused much disquiet in the settlements, where Indian laborers are employed, and the lives of unoffending white men having been put in jeopardy by such lawless acts, and complaint in due form having been made against Cave Cooper and Henry Beazee, upon oath, by the proper authorities of Lynchburgh-on-Mocosme, for murder in shooting, while riding through the said village, an unoffending Indian laborer, and the peace and safety of said village having been much endangered by the said unprovoked murder, I do therefore offer the above reward to be paid upon conviction by the proper authorities to any one who will arrest the aforesaid Cave Cooper and Henry Beazee, or any other person, who may be convicted of murdering an unarmed and unoffending Indian within this district.
