The Humboldt Times gives the names of a number of persons who have lately been killed by the Red Cap Indians, in the neighborhood of Weitspeck, in that county. They were as follows:—

Wm. Wheeler, Thos. O'Neal, — Praxter, — Dunham, J. Smith and his partner; besides wounding many others, among them Messrs. Johnson and Lamont, the latter mortally. Colonel Buchanan had immediately despatched Captain Judah with 26 U. S. soldiers to the scene of action, which was 40 miles from Union City.
