

ROUND VALLEY RESERVATION.—A Washington correspondent of the *Union* writes as follows: "Speaking of the Northern Indians reminds me that Superintendent Hanson, of that department, is on here for the purpose of making some arrangement by which the settlers on Round Valley Reservation shall be indemnified for the improvements which they have made within the limits of the Reserve. It is proposed to appoint an appraiser, whose decision shall be final. Hanson is not likely to secure the approval of the Government provisional purchase of the Smith River valley lands for a Reservation. It is thought that the recent mineral discoveries there, and the position of the valley, will render it unfit for a Reservation. The California delegation in Congress, I believe, take this view of the case, as just and correct."
