

INDIAN TROUBLES ON THE KLAMATH. Judge
Pletcher came down on the last Oregon steamer
for the purpose of getting assistance from Gen.
Wool and the Indian Superintendent to quell the
insurrection among the Indians on the Klamath
river. The whites have been hunting the Indians
in the mountains since about the 1st January,
and about eighty are known to have been killed.
In turn the Indians killed eight white men. The
difficulty originated in the Indians killing an ox
belonging to Stephen Smith, for which they offer-
ed to pay, but some whites burning a rancheria
in the neighborhood, they fled.
