

~~SURVEY OF ROUND VALLEY. The Napa Reporter says that orders from Washington have been received instructing the Surveyor General to have Round Valley, in Mendocino County, surveyed for an Indian Reservation. Round Valley is the richest tract in the basin of Eel River. It contains 18,000 acres of good soil, and the climate is mild, regular, and moist; plenty of timber and water, and the land is covered with rich grass. The valley is about ten miles long by six miles wide, and it is almost enclosed by the north fork of Eel River, which makes the bend that encloses the valley. The centre of the valley is prairie land, along the banks of which there is a great growth of black oak timber, valuable for fence rails and building purposes.~~
