

WHITES MASSACRED ON PITT RIVER.—A company consisting of H. A. Lockhart, Z. R. Rogers, Daniel Brant, Boles, and a German called John, who stopped on Pitt river last summer, where they owned ferries and had a considerable amount of stock, have been massacred by the Indians and their property destroyed. Two men, named Whitney and Fowler, who had worked for Mr. Lockhart last summer, started from Yreka, the last of January, to return to said party, and when they arrived there found the cabins burned, ferries destroyed and men and stock gone, and every indication of their destruction by the Indians. They narrowly escaped falling into the hands of the Indians themselves, and were obliged to travel in the night through two and three feet of snow to make their escape back to Yreka, where they arrived after enduring the greatest privation, being obliged to feed on their dog. Capt. Judah, of Fort Jones, went below to confer with Gen. Wool in regard to the steps proper to be taken in the premises.
