

INDIAN OUTRAGES IN HUMBOLDT.—By way of San Francisco, we have advices from Humboldt Bay to Feb. 29d. The *Times* of that date gives the following list of outrages which had recently occurred;—Thirty-nine Diggers were killed in one battle by citizens from whom they had stolen cattle on Upper Mattole. Four more were killed near North Yager creek, a few days later. They had stolen a lot of hogs from settlers on Kneeland's Prairie. The residence of Jno. Fulwider, in Kettle-shou Valley, was sacked on the 15th ult. The Indians fired on Fulwider, but did not hit him. Over three hundred hogs were driven off and killed at the Eel River settlement, which had been deserted. Larrabee's house was burned, and Ann Queen, cook at the ranch killed. The Healdsburg mail rider was two weeks late, and it was feared he had been killed by Indians between Long Valley and Hydesville.
