

★THE MENDOCINO WAR JOB DISPOSED OF.—We learn, on good authority, that the Committee sent to Mendocino to inquire into the facts of the late Indian war in that region returns with no very high opinion of the means which has been resorted to, both among the settlers there and their friends here, to manufacture an Indian war. On the other hand, the testimony they have taken goes to establish what was long before surmised, and openly charged in some quarters, that the whites, and not the Indians have been guilty of the principal outrages committed in that section. The Committee proceeded as far as Round Valley, and took a mass of evidence relating to the past year's transactions in that vicinity, some of it being the testimony of parties who are implicated in the cruelties practiced on the Indians, and in the raising of the war expeditions against them. Out of their own mouths, we are credibly informed, some of them stand condemned. The Committee will report in a few days, and with one or two exceptions, all are said to be of one opinion respecting the state of affairs in Mendocino. This, the authors of our war jobs in and out of the Legislature may be assured, is not very flattering for the cause of the Jarboe sympathizers.
