Middleton, then of Company C, brought to this Post another installment of Indian prisoners captured in Trinity. They belong to the Trinity tribes, and are about the last of those Indians remaining out. Much credit is due Lieut. Middleton and Company C, of the Mountaineers, for their untiring diligence, scouting and hunting those troublesome Diggers out from the mountains and caves, dense forests, and steep, rocky and dark caverns.”
