

INDIAN WAR.—It affords us pleasure to announce that the Indian war in our county may now safely be considered very nearly at an end. Gen. Kibbe was in town on Thursday and entered into a contract with Capt. Woodly, of the bark Fanny Major, to take another batch of prisoners to Mendocino. The General informs us that Capt. Messie had, on Monday last, seventy-five prisoners, and that Lieut. Winslett had captured about twenty-five more which had not reached camp when he left. The Indians are entirely starved out, and the weather has been so severe that they could not hunt in the mountains and dare not go down on the streams. The Redwood prisoners captured by a party of citizens, some two weeks since, on Mud River, are pointing out the camps of Redwoods to the volunteers, and the Indians are captured without difficulty. The General left here under the impression that a clean sweep of the Redwood tribe would be made this week, and hopes that some time next week he will be able to disband the company. Quite a number of guns have been brought in, among them some very fine rifles.

It is of the utmost importance that the expedition should be brought to a close in time to have the bills examined and paid before the adjournment of the Legislature. A friend of ours who has recently returned from Sacramento informs us that he had a conversation with Governor Weller on the subject, and his Excellency expressed himself as being highly pleased with the manner in which the campaign has been conducted, and stated that he should urge upon the Legislature the propriety and actual necessity of paying the expenses incurred out of the State Treasury forthwith.
