

**Klamath Indians--Superintendent Han-
son.**

The Washington correspondent of the Sacramento Union, speaks thus of a proposed treaty with the Klamath Indians. He also speaks as follows of Superintendent Hanson and his Reservations:

Some year or two ago Congress made an appropriation of \$400,000 for the purpose of making a treaty with the Nez Perce Indians, which appropriation has never been used, and no treaty has ever been made. The Senate has just passed a bill diverting \$20,000 of this appropriation to make a treaty with the Klamath Indians, who roam over a large section of country in Southern Oregon and Northern California, making depredations upon the adjacent settlers and levying extortionate tribute upon the emigrant streams of emigration which pass through their country from California, bound to the Northern mines. As has been before noticed in this correspondence a separate superintendency is proposed for these Indians, and a treaty with them will facilitate this arrangement and bring on the consummation of a reliable check on the warlike propensities of those mischievous fellows.

Speaking of the Northern Indians reminds me that Superintendent Hanson, of that department, is on here for the purpose of making some arrangement by which the settlers in Round Valley Reservation shall be indemnified for the improvements which they have made within the limits of the Reserve. It is proposed to appoint an appraiser, whose decision shall be final. Hanson is not likely to secure the approval of the Government of his provisional purchase of the Smith River valley lands for a Reservation. It is thought that the recent mineral discoveries there, and the position of the valley will render it unfit for a Reservation. The California delegation in Congress, I believe, take this view of the case as just and correct.
