

**PRODUCT OF INDIAN LABORS ON THE KLAMATH RESERVATION,**—The aggregate productions of the Klamath Reservation for the last year were; Potatoes, 1,250,000 pounds; peas, 30,000 pounds; oats, 13,000 pounds; beans, 6,000 pounds; turnips, 16,000 bushels; pumpkins, 5,000 bushels; wheat, 6,000 pounds. Nearly all the work was done by the Indians, and cost the government little or nothing. Three times the amount will be raised the coming year.
