

ALLEGED KIDNAPPING IN MENDOCINO. —

A paragraph has been published in several newspapers of the state purporting to be taken from the Mendocino *Herald*, to the effect that about the first of March, G. H. Woodman was arrested on the charge of kidnapping Indian children. We understand the facts to be, that certain interested parties caused Woodman to be arrested for alleged kidnapping of thirteen Indian children, but after a rigid examination in which all the circumstances of the affair were elicited, he was discharged and fully exonerated. It appears that Woodman resides near an Indian rancheria and has employed several of the natives and protected their children, and has thus interfered with the speculating purposes of other parties. — *Union*.
