### Indian Meeting on Eel River.

A meeting of the farmers and citizens generally of Eel river, was held at Hydesville on the 12th inst., at which Wm. T. Olmstead, formerly of this place, presided. We publish the resolutions passed on the occasion, as they speak the sentiments of the citizens of that section in regard to the late Indian massacre, and Indian affairs generally in that county. The proceedings were published in the Humboldt Times :

*Resolved,* That this meeting deeply regret the ~~late~~ unfortunate and indiscriminate destruction of Indian life in this county, and at the same time find it their bounden duty to express their indignation at the conduct of Government, which has been the whole cause of that sad affair.

*Resolved,* That as it is the white man who pays and supports Government, their lives and property should be the first to receive protection from that Government. But as white men, and human beings of a superior race—from principles of humanity—we are sensible that the Indian should have protection also.

*Resolved,* That as Maj. Raines has kindly and humanely offered the inhabitants of Eel river to meet and assist them in any measures that may tend to promote peace and quietness between the Indians and the citizens, and that for the obtaining of this object we are firmly convinced that it is necessary to separate the Indians from amongst the whites, we therefore earnestly and respectfully request him to cause the Indians to be collected together at some convenient point, and there kept in charge of the troops under his command till the proper authority shall cause their removal.

*Resolved,* That this meeting pledge themselves in good-faith to use all honorable means to carry out the intentions of the foregoing resolutions.

*Resolved,* That one copy of these resolutions be sent to the Humboldt Times for publication, and one to Maj. Raines, with the thanks of this meeting for the interest he manifests in the matter.
