California News Items.

The Indians on Nome Lackoe Reservation have had a glorious rabbit hunt lately, having caught and killed during a few hours, hundreds of these animals. The method adopted by the hunters is very simple. A number of nets are procured and stretched between stakes, which are planted in the ground similar to fence posts. A space about equal to the length of the net is left between each one, which is guarded by parties placed there for that purpose. Another party scouts the brush, which frightens the rabbit and it immediately tries to escape. The first effort is to try and get through the space, but it is met there by too much opposition. It then makes for the net in which it gets entangled, and before it can extricate itself it is dispatched with a club.

A very singular proceeding, or rather a failure to proceed, on the part of the Coroner of Santa Clara county, is related by the San Jose Tribune. It appears that the body of a man was found floating in the slough near Alviso, and the Coroner was notified but declined acting in the premises, on the presumption that the law considers only such subjects as have been feloniously killed, to be proper subjects for an inquest, whereas this man had in all probability fallen into the water while in a state of intoxication. A Justice of the Peace held an inquest upon the body and it was ascertained that the name of the deceased was Alexander Gardener. The cause of his death was not found.

A tragical affair occurred at San Jose, on Tuesday, Feb. 29th, growing out of the late murder of Paul C. Shore. The trial of Thomas Seal and Alex. Robb for the murder had commenced that day. S. J. Crosby, a witness for Seal, and who was also implicated in the murder, was shot and instantly killed by Thomas Shore, a brother of the murdered man. Mr. L. P. Ferguson was also killed by a stray bullet. The testimony before the Coroner's jury, as to whether Crosby or Shore fired the first shot, is conflicting.

Officer Blitz, says the S. F. Times, saved the lives of a lady and her child on Sunday, by springing at the head of a runaway horse attached to a buggy, near the corner of Second and Market streets, and arresting him in his mad career. But for this gallant act, the lady and child must have been seriously injured or killed. The grateful lady offered her preserver

The Alta Telegraph Company propose a submarine telegraph cable across the Bay of Carquinez, to connect Martinez and Berkeley. The distance is about one mile. The cable weighs 6,500 pounds. It is about an inch in diameter, and composed of copper gutta, rope yarn and galvanized wire.

The anti-Austrian fulminations of the press had been discontinued, where "rentes" rose; but the rise was not sustained.

The king of Sardinia is determined on making an attempt to drive out the Austrians from his kingdom, strong enough to resist both that power and France. He contemplates uniting under his rule Venice and
