

Who, Ray?—The *Mendocino Herald* of the 10th, learns from W. H. Ray that a "détachment from one of the companies stationed at or near Fort Humboldt was sent out to chastise the Indians for some depredations made by them upon the whites, and attacked the rancharia, but were repulsed with a loss of one killed and one wounded. The wounded man was shot through his cartridge box, the ball lodging in his side, making but a slight wound."

The *Herald* was misinformed in regard to this matter altogether. It has reference to the same attack mentioned by us last week; in which Capt. Flynn and his party killed 38 Indians and took a lot of prisoners. It is true that one man was killed and another had his cap box struck.
