

INDIAN PRISONERS.—On the 26th ult., as private N. Stansberry, Co. A, C. M., was returning from Fort Humboldt to Camp Iuqua, he fell in with three Indians—one "buck" and two squaws. He was alone, but nevertheless he attempted to capture them. The buck, however, succeeded in escaping, notwithstanding he was pursued by two or three bullets from Stansberry's pistol. The squaws were captured and taken to Camp Iuqua, and on the 31st inst. were brought to Fort Humboldt, for safe keeping. This is very good, but it would have been better if the buck had not escaped.
