

SLAUGHTER OF INDIANS.—The *Petaluma Journal*, of the 15th learns that the Indians are being slaughtered by the wholesale at Round Valley. A gentleman just from there says that within the past three weeks, from three to four hundred Indian—men, women, and children—have been killed by the whites. The cause of this wholesale killing, is the continued depredations by the Indians upon the stock of the settlers, and a resistance to the Reservation officials in their attempts to collect the Indians upon the Reservation. In one instance, a soldier belonging to Lieut. Dillon's command, was mortally wounded by the Indians. It is stated that the women and children are mostly spared by the settlers, and taken to the Reservation; but the men are more safely disposed of.
