They were painted and dressed up in every conceivable fashion of the fantastic and horrible, and danced and howled, and otherwise made night hideous, for some six or eight hours "by Shrewsbury clock." After which the squaws indulged in a sumptuous repast of broiled beef guts, and the warriors partook heartily of an abundant lay-out of *chemuck* composed of pulverized acorns, grass seed and preserved worms.
