The troops escorting the Indian Commissioners, were, as late as the 22d inst., encamped on the San Joaquin, among the foot hills of the Sierra Nevada. There were about five hundred Indians about camp, and a thousand more expected in a few days to treat with the government agents—some of them the refractory Chow-chillas.

A lump of gold weighing 28 lbs 4 ounces, has been taken out of the garden lately occupied by Mr. Holden, of Sonora, owned by Wheaton, Lockwood & Co. The whole produce has been exceedingly rich, averaging from 10 to 15 ounces per day.
