

Pitt River. INDIANS.—S. R. Rockhart writes from Yreka, April 21st, that the party who had started in pursuit of Indians had had two battles with them, one at Hot Springs and the other ten miles above the ferry, on the East Fork of the Pitt River. Nineteen Indians had been killed, and many more wounded. Twenty-three prisoners had been taken, but the most of them were squaws and children and were released again.
