

Inhuman murder.—A man named Doyle was murdered near the Columbia mines a few weeks since, and nothing has been revealed as to the circumstances under which, or by whom, the deed was committed. His body was found secreted by the wayside, shockingly disfigured, his heart taken out, and skull fractured in several places. The prevailing impression among the miners of Columbia appeared to be, that this murder had been committed by white men, and every item of evidence seemed to justify this conclusion. Doyle had with him, when last seen, about \$2000 of which his person was found plundered, and it is supposed the manner of death, and gross mutilation of the remains, had been resorted to to convey the impression that Indians had committed the deed. "The black-hearted fiends! who, from beneath a white skin, boast a mental superiority, and claim the sphere of our race these daily walk."
