

## Legislature.

The Legislature elected at the mass meeting held in Sacramento city on Monday the 30th of April met by appointment at Mr Slater's room on Tuesday the 1st of May.

Present Messrs John McDougal, Peter Slater, Barton Lee, Henry Chever, Wm Pettot, W M Carpenter, Chas C Southward, M M McGarver, Jas King, Samuel Brauman. Absent J S Fowler.

The Legislature was organized by the election of M M McGarver for Speaker, and Jas King as Clerk pro tem. On motion Jefferson's Manual was adopted for the government of the House. On motion Messrs Brauman, Chever and McDougal were appointed a committee of three to procure a Statute Book.

Mr Carpenter having stated that Mr Bates, first Alcalde, desired to communicate something of importance to the House, the Speaker by request appointed Mr Carpenter a committee of one to wait on the first Alcalde and request his attendance.

On motion of Mr McDougal it was declared expedient to appoint the following standing committees: on Revenue 2, on Judiciary 3, on Public Buildings 1, on Crimes and Punishments 3, on Indian Affairs 2. On motion the rules of the House were suspended to allow Mr Bates, the first Alcalde, to make his communication to the House, after which the House went into the election of standing committees, which resulted as follows: on revenue, Messrs Brauman and Lee; on public buildings, P Slater; on crimes and punishments, Messrs King, Chever and Carpenter; on Indian affairs, Messrs Pettot and Southward. On motion of Mr Brauman, the rules of the House were suspended for the purpose of appointing the Speaker on the Judiciary committee, when Messrs McDougal, Fowler

and McCarter were appointed the committee on Judiciary.

On motion, Messrs King and Carpenter were appointed a committee to procure a Clerk for this House. On motion the committee on Public Buildings were instructed to procure a suitable building for this body.

On motion, the several committees were instructed to report at the next meeting.

On motion of Mr Chever the subject of the boundary of this District was referred to the committee on Revenue.

On motion, the meeting adjourned to Monday next at two, P. M.
