Indian Troubles North--Particulars of a Fight TEHAMA, May 4th Tom Gefrick, from the head of Thomes creek, brings intelligence that a man named Watson was murdered by Indians near Stony creek, while hunting cattle, Tuesday During the next two days, the Indians killed Darling' Indian sheep hezder, and broke into a house and stole what arms and ammunition was in it. and committed several other depredations. The settlers then organized a party under D. Lacock of Thomes creek, and Shannon of Round Val ley, to follow and chastise the lindians, and engaged a party of Nome Lackee Indians to act as guides, who reported them to be encamp near, Jake Henderson's, about six miles west of Nome Lackee Reservation. The party attacked the camp night. morning killing daylight this fourt Indians, three squaws, and taking four squaw prisoners. Shannon was killed in the engage ment. and a man named Ford was dangerously wounded. The Indiana refreated into the coast mountains, and our init mant states that a party are in pursuit of them. They are said to be about forty Pitt Indians escaped from Bome Cult Reservation and two Mexicans.
