

FROM PITT RIVER.—The last of the Pitt River volunteers came in to town on Friday last. We have been unable to see any of them, to learn any of the particulars of the close of the campaign. We have been informed, however, that they report another battle with the Indians after Messrs. Fox and Lockhart left, in which they killed more of the enemy than had been killed before, and took a number of women and children prisoners. According to this report the whole number of Indians killed is fifty-nine. They are reported to have brought in thirteen children, which is just the number of prisoners in their hands at the time Messrs. Fox and Lockhart left.—*Yreka Union.*
