

INDIANS WORSTED.—A dispatch dated Smith's Crossing, Humboldt county, Nevada, May 6th, says:

"A party of seven men from Trinity, en route for Pine Forest District, were attacked by Indians early yesterday morning, twenty-four miles from Humboldt river, near the Honey Lake road. James Emory, of Trinity, was mortally wounded. The boys had the pleasure of lifting four scalps. They are now reinforcing to go back on the war path to-morrow. Jo Voshay was one of the party engaged. He had three bullet holes through his clothing, but still lives."
