CHURN CREEK—INDIAN DIFFICULTIES.—The Indians on Churn Creek, about eighty miles from this place, on the east side of the Sacramento river, are becoming very troublesome. They have stolen a great many mules, and are constantly watching for opportunities to take human life. A few days since Henry Welden was pursued for several miles by a band of these Indians and narrowly escaped with his life. In consequence of these outrages a company of miners has been formed in that vicinity, for the purpose of driving the Indians to a safer distance or exterminating them. The company is well equipped and will be able to do efficient service in the mountains.
