

INDIAN RESERVATION.—We learn from Lieut. Randell, U. S. A., who arrived in town on Thursday, from the Klameth, that Mr. Whipple, Indian agent, and Capt. Jones, U. S. A., have selected that portion of country lying between Young's ferry and the mouth of the Klameth, and running five miles from the river on each side, as a site for a reservation. The agent has probably selected the best site that could have been obtained, provided the Indians can be forced or persuaded to go there; which we fear cannot be done, as there are people who are daily persuading the poor Indians against going.
