The Mineral Wealth of Michigan.

The Detroit Weekly Advertiser gives
some very interesting information on this
subject—the result of the patient labors of
Dr. Houghton and other gentlemen, who
have been engaged in developing the riches
of that State. Michigan contains coal, and
in the neighborhood of Sandstone, two hun-
dred and fifty tons have been raised during
the past season. The coal is of good quality,
and the working is safe and easy. The beds
outcrop for a hundred miles or more on the
Grand River, and from more recent discov-
ries would seem to extend to the Straits of
Mackinaw. Quantities have been sold in
Jackson county at \$3 per ton, and when
some system is employed in the mining, it is
expected to be much cheaper. The State is
working a shaft by convict labor in the pris-
on of Jackson.

Copper occurs frequently in the upper
peninsula, and silver has also been found to
a considerable extent. Cannon coal has been
discovered in Jackson county which makes a
most excellent gas.

The Level of the Great Lakes.

There is said to be a mysterious rise and
fall of the level of the great American lakes,
which has long occupied the attention of
many scientific men. In addition to the va-
riations which depend upon the changes of
seasons, there is also a local, slow, irregular
oscillation, of a few inches to a few feet, not
to be predicted, its period of oscillation be-
ing from three to five minutes, and which
continues from one to twenty-four hours.
In the course of several years' observations
no wave has been seen over two feet in height.

Foreign Miner's Tax.

The recent Legislature passed a very atrin-
gent amendment to the Foreign Miner's Tax
Law, which provides that no person not a
citizen of the United States, or who shall not
have declared his intentions to become such,
shall be allowed to take gold from the mines
of this State, or hold a mining claim therein,
unless he shall first procure and pay a license
therefor.
Any person or company hiring foreigners,
or renting, or on shares, or in any manner
connected with any foreigner or foreigners,
in working, or in possession of any mining
ground, shall be held liable for the amount
of license of each and every foreigner with
whom such person or company is so connect-
ed or interested. All mining grounds work-
ed or possessed, all improvements, all tools
and machinery used in working such ground
by said person or company, shall be subject
to sale for the payment of said license tax.
The collectors have power to require any
person or company believed to be indebted
to any such foreigner, to answer under oath
as to such indebtedness, or the possession of
money, gold dust or other property. In
case a party is indebted, he may collect from
such party the amount of such license.
