

INDIANS RETURNING.—Mr. W. B. Frazer, of Martinez, who has been hunting stock through the Cow Creek, Churn Creek, and Pitt River country, paid a visit to our town a few days ago. He says there are quite a number of Indians in that section who have returned from Mendocino Reservation.— He saw one, in company with others, whom he identified as being one of those captured by Gen. Kibbe and sent to Mendocino last fall, and who stated that they are all coming back to their old homes. Mr. F. describes him as a very shrewd and intelligent fellow, and appears to have profited considerably during his intercourse with the whites. Several squaws have also returned. The young Indian said they came across by the head of Stoney Creek, in small bands, as they are afraid the whites would discover and kill them if they traveled in larger numbers.
