

NEWS FROM THE SEAT OF WAR.—A fight has taken place between the Whites and the Indians near Johnson's rancho.

We are indebted to Gen. Winn, for the contents of a letter received by him from Major Rodgers last evening. The Indians to the number of 300 were encamped near Johnson's rancho, when they encountered 100 men under Col. Graham. Before the main force under Major Rodgers could come up, 3 of the whites were wounded, and one mortally so. Twelve of the Indians were killed.

When the messenger left, Major Rogers' party were felling trees across the South Fork in order to pass over and pursue the enemy.
