

**ANOTHER VOLUNTEER COMPANY.**—A company of twenty or twenty-five men was organized at Hydenville, this week, to go in search of the Indians who murdered Ellison, and who have been killing stock in the Bald Hill and Yager Creek country for the past few months. The company started out on Thursday, equipped and provisioned for a scout of six weeks. They are men well acquainted with the character and habits of the Indians they are in search of, and we doubt not that these Yager Creek Redskins will pay dear for the life they have taken and the beef they have eaten.

It is to be regretted that the late volunteer expedition under Gen. Kibbe, who so effectually stopped the operations of the hostile Redwoods, did not have more time to devote to the Indians who are now creating trouble. A correspondent writing from Hydenville informs us that several hundred head of stock have already been driven from Yager Creek to Mattole, and that the remainder are to follow as soon as they can be collected, and that this fine grazing section is to be left to the Indians.

Capt. Lovell is now in that vicinity, with a detachment of U. S. troops, and will no doubt do all that his time and orders will allow him to do. We await the return of his command with considerable anxiety, as there are various speculations as to what he will accomplish.
