

INDIAN DIFFICULTIES IN THE NORTH.—A dispatch from Shasta, of May 25th, says that the Indians have commenced hostilities on Butte creek in good earnest. On the 22d they chased six men for a distance of six miles, to the camp, there being eighteen Indians in pursuit. On the 24th the Indians attacked the house of James Kinzie, where the men were, and the whites killed five Indians, one of whom was chief of the tribe. The Indians have killed some cattle and run others off. The whites are generally in want of arms.—A company is being organized in Yreka for the purpose of punishing them; Butte Valley is about 25 miles east of Yreka.
