

~~COMPANY C.~~—Capt. Long has returned from Trinity county, bringing with him nineteen men, under command of Lieut. Tom Middleton, to be mustered into service, in the battalion of Mountaineers. Owing to the difficulty of procuring transportation to Trinity county the men will be sent to this place as they are enrolled, and go into quarters here until the company is full. Their arms, clothing, blankets and provisions are all here, and, with the exception of the arms, will be issued as the men come in. The arms do not issue until the company is full.

~~Now an opportunity offers for the people of Trinity, particularly in the lower part of the county, to rid their territory of Indians and avenge the outrages which the diggers have committed. The people there are also aware that their property is valueless and their lives in danger so long as things remain in their present shape. Lieut. Middleton will return to Trinity so soon as the men he brought down are suitably provided for, and we are confident the company will fill up soon.~~
