

FOURTEEN INDIANS KILLED.—On the 14th, a portion of the detachment from Fort Gaston, composed of 6 regulars and 5 volunteer guides, accompanied by John Brehmer of Blue Slide, and O. M. Turner, of Arcata, attacked a large ranch of Indians on Boulder creek, about seven miles from Blue Slide. After a spirited engagement the result was found to be fourteen Indians killed, and twenty or more wounded. Over 2,000 lbs. of beef was found in the ranches; also many articles of clothing and household goods, recognized as property which had been stolen but a few days previous from the settlers. The stock raisers and farmers on Mad river are in high glee over this victory, and return their heartfelt thanks to the gallant little company who achieved it. The attack was led, we are informed, by Corporal Green Wilkinson, of the Volunteers. — *Humboldt Times.*
