
THE VOLUNTEER COMPANY .- J. B. Ha gans, who was sent by the people of this county to solicit the aid of the Governor in our behalf, in Indian matters, writes back that he had an interview with Governor Downey, and that his Excellency talked favorable to calling out Capt. Wright's Company. He proposes, however, that if the company take the field they do so under an agreement of so much per month, and fornish themselves. The Governor thinks that, owing to the opposition in Indian matters last winter, it would be impossible to find merchants who would be willing to supply the expedition, except at ruinous rates. This is stated by Col. Hagans as being the substance of the Governor's views, with a promise to either come in person or write Col. Hagans to San Francisco, before the steamer sailed. His Excellency, however, very much to the disappointment of Col Hagans, did not do either. We shall know more by the nex steamer.
