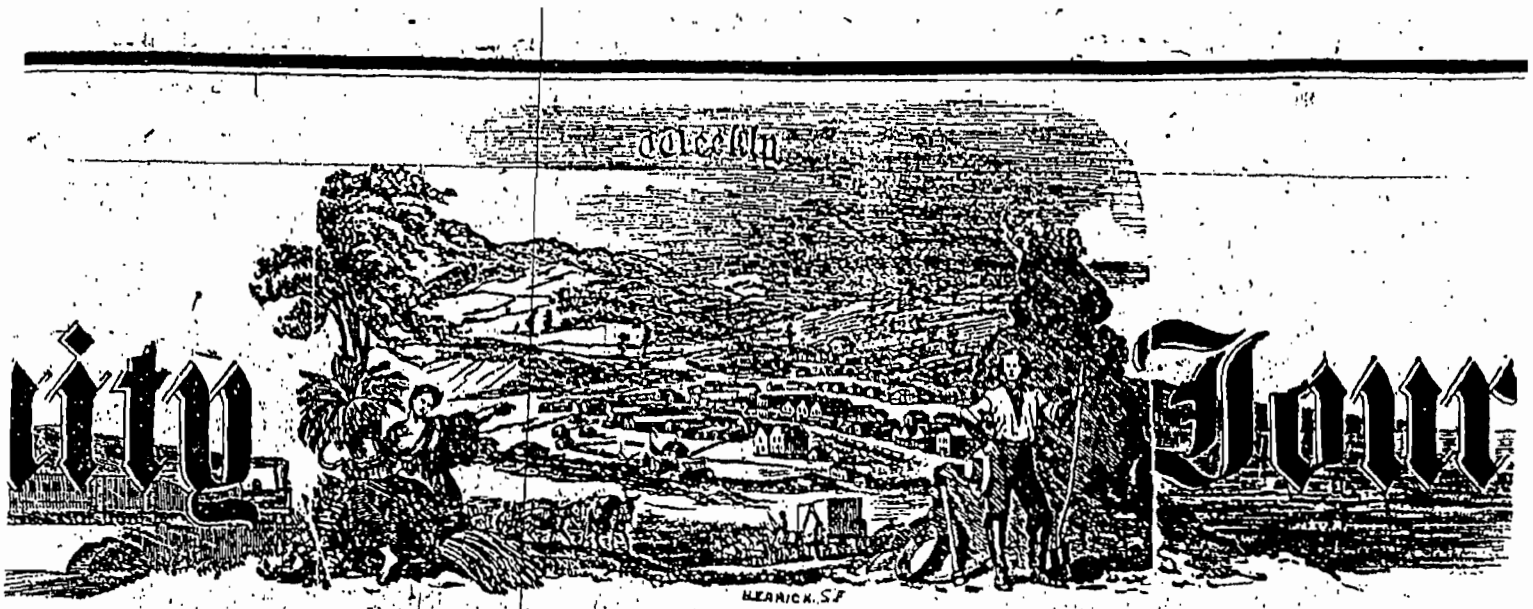


INDIAN DEPREDACTIONS IN SOUTH-WEST TRINITY.

—Mr. Peter Donnelly, who arrived from Humboldt county on Tuesday, furnishes the following information :

On Thursday of last week a band of Indians from the mountains made a descent on Hyampom valley, killed two valuable dogs belonging to settlers, stole two rifles, and robbed several cabins of their entire contents, and immediately started for their headquarters on Mad river. Six of the citizens of Hyampom armed themselves, started in pursuit, and overtook the band, numbering from seventy-five to one hundred, on Pilot Creek, where a spirited fight followed, in which a number of Indians were known to be killed—the exact number not ascertainable. We regret to hear that Hank Young and Pierce Trimble were severely wounded in the engagement.
